The Creation Shop will be a professional art studio where to create his pottery and sculpture pieces and be a place to serve the community with demonstrations and workshops. Having had a personal studio space before, Buseth owns the equipment to set up his new studio. The grant will fund some of the equipment and supplies needed to create the workshop space. His goal is to work with both the general public and underserved clientele in a safe and comfortable environment. The Creation Shop will provide him the long-term means to continue his artistic creations and to share his passion for arts in a central studio location.

Jessica Chipman Douglas County \$2,600

Chipman's Legacy project is the writing of a Zoom/streaming play concerning topics of cultural understanding, antiracism, and addressing inherent biases, confronting with multiple points of view and behaviors among one's families and friends. The play will be written specifically for a Zoom/streaming format; in fact, the characters themselves will be on a Zoom call with one another. The premise: three former college roommates make plans for an epic road trip celebrating their twenty-year college reunion. Their plans are derailed by Covid-19 and they settle for a series of Zoom calls. As they are able to peek into each others' lives, literally and figuratively, the characters realize many changes have occurred in their friendships and lives in the twenty years since their graduation, causing them to rethink their life philosophies and what they want out of their next twenty years.

Kendra Gilsdorf Becker County \$1,599

Gilsdorf's Legacy project is to write, direct and produce a live 30-minute radio broadcast from the Historic Holmes Theatre stage of an original play, "The Arrival of King Isbit." The play brings to life several fictional characters including King Isbit and Polar Pete who have become beloved symbols of the city's annual Polar Fest which typically takes place in February.

Legacy Arts & Cultural Heritage Grants Non profi

Non profit arts organizations, public institutions and other non profit groups are awarded funds to enhance art access, art education and art cultural heritage in the LRAC region.

Andria Theatre Douglas County \$9,590

The Andria Theatre will purchase and install the equipment and technology to live stream programming to increase accessibility to theater, record productions for the theatre's archives, and allow a new avenue for delivering educational classes. Those populations most affected by the accessibility factor are senior citizens and others limited by transportation, youth limited by numbers able to meet safely on-site, and the hard of hearing as live streaming and video-on demand have close captioning functions. This equipment will be useful for years to come in creating a new stream of income by monetizing online platforms; it will allow distance learning classes for youth beyond the confines of miles and time to come to Alexandria; it will increase access for marginalized populations especially the elderly. Streaming will allow for nearly unlimited numbers of people to participate as patrons and students.

Central Square Pope County \$7,300

Central Square will bring the community together in a Covid safe environment outdoors on Saturday, July 24, 2021. The event will take place the same day as the Glenwood All-School Class Reunion, which was postponed from last year. During the day there will be an art fair and live music during the afternoon by a local duo. The grant funded concert will take place shortly after the reunion, on the same grounds. Mason Dixon Line (MDL) is the Mid-West's premier Country-Rock outfit. The band focuses on a live show that brings their audiences the biggest hits of the 1960's, 1970's, 1980's and 1990's by country music Hall of Famers and icons. This event will bring old classmates and members of the community together for the first time since the pandemic.

Fergus Falls Center for the Arts Otter Tail County \$21,000

FFC4TA will present their 2021 Summer Concert Series in the new green space, created by the City, behind the old Regional Treatment Center which forms a natural amphitheater. Concerts will take place on Sunday evenings through the summer. Six of the eight concerts received grant funding which will feature John McAndrew, The Heartshakers (a Tom Petty Experience), Tonic Sol Fa, Matt Vee's Celebration of Neil Diamond, the Purple Hulls Duo, Harmonious Wail, Tony DeBlois (pianist), and Pavlo (guitarist). A Center for the Arts continues to bring in high caliber arts & entertainment this summer to instill arts into the community and public life.

Historic Holmes Theatre Becker County \$26,500

Historic Holmes Theatre will purchase and install a high grade movie system that will allow HHT to present theatregoers with a quality movie experience and to present multi-media productions on stage. This will include a large, center screen, laser projector, zoom lens, and mounting equipment. HHT will fund the appropriate licenses associated with legally presenting movies at the Holmes Theatre. Among the ideas being pursued, a regional film festival drawing on professors from Concordia College in Moorhead and Minnesota State University-Moorhead film studies program, a monthly movie club, live-streamed events from places such as the Metropolitan Opera, community movie events, movie showings for summer day kids and area senior citizens, as well as working with school leaders to foster educational opportunities for members of the local school district's Native American population.

Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County \$6,280 County

HCSCC will sponsor an exhibit with the overall theme "healing through art" focusing on veterans in the region. The exhibition will be on display at the Hjemkomst October 2021 to mid- March 2022 with a private reception for veterans on Oct. 5, 2021. The public performance of vets reading their writing and performing songs they have written will take place Nov. 10. All participants will benefit from the process of bringing together veterans and the art that helps them to heal the trauma experienced in service. Working with veteran Bemidji writer Wendell Affield, participants explore experiences regarding war and reintegration. Veterans will also create visual arts to express themselves through masking making and storytelling.

Henning Landmark Center Otter Tail County \$7,710

The Landmark Center Arts Camp Series will provide summer arts workshops for all adults bringing in 4 artists to provide 5 different workshops for adult and youth participants. These activities will include a 1-day multi-generational painting workshop by Lana Beck. Beck will also design and oversee a community mural painting project using a 16x16' bathroom structure located in the Henning City Park. A group of local volunteers of all ages will be invited to take part in this project which will promote the arts, volunteerism, community, and creative inspiration. Additional activities include John Offutt's glass blowing demonstration, a watercolor gouache painting class with Ruth Hanson, and a series of pottery classes with Mimi Seykora.

Kaddatz Galleries Otter Tail County \$20,740

Kaddatz Galleries will launch the Charles Beck Printmaking Center. The center will provide classes and workshops with experienced teaching artists, Michael Weatherly and Naomi Schliesman, in printmaking from July of 2021 - April 2022 serving youth (K-12), adults and a teen/young adult Narcotics Anonymous (NA) group. In addition, the center will support printmaking artists in the advancement of their careers by providing them with the equipment, materials and space to create new work during open studio hours and positioning them for exhibition and sales opportunities within the Kaddatz's two gallery spaces and beyond. Students and Center members will exhibit their work in gallery and virtually in April/May 2022.

Kicks Band of Fargo Moorhead

Clay County

\$6,750

Kicks Band will present two artist residencies during the coming school year for students and communities at Moorhead High School and Fergus Falls High School sharing their love of jazz music. Each residency will offer master classes to the students and an evening of music for the public, "A Journey through Jazz". This concert guides audiences through the origins, evolution and cultural influences of jazz. This project will create lasting memories of having a great time learning about jazz. At its best, it will inspire young musicians to see jazz in a different light and motivate many to the serious study of jazz traditions.

Perham Center for the Arts

Otter Tail County

\$9,130

Perham C4TA will install air conditioning in their building with the grant funding a portion of the total cost. Providing a climate controlled building would be advantageous to offering more cultural events for the public. The location of the Perham Center for the Arts is in a high volume tourist region. The board has received positive comments from both permanent and seasonal residents on the variety of opportunities provided at the arts center. These presentations offer extra incentives for residents and visitors to spend more time in the area which also enhances the local economy.

The Rourke Art Gallery Museum

Clay County

\$5,250

The Rourke will be upgrading their archival storage for their permanent collection in their on-site climate-controlled storage space on the museum building's third level. Once deployed and fabricated, these shelves and containers will approximately triple the existing storage capacity of the floor space they will occupy. With more vertical storage space, they have anticipated the need for a safe means of accessing the upper shelves of artwork so we are including an OSHA compliant rolling stair ladder with a larger platform at the top step in this project's budget.

**Stevens County Historical Society** 

**Stevens County** 

\$7,680

SCHS will sponsor the Makers Art Festival, a one day event, on Saturday, July 10, 2021, spread throughout Morris to allow for social distancing. A wide variety of art forms will involve all five senses: attendees will share their pandemic stories in writing with the museum, paint a portion of the community mural on the exterior of the Stone's Throw Café building, shop for local produce at the farmer's market, shop for local art from local art vendors, listen to music by local artists at the East Side Park band shell as well as on the museum lawn, pick up a take-and-make STEAM kit for kids at the public library, take art classes through the Prairie Renaissance Cultural Alliance, observe artists in action through demonstrations, watch, taste, and smell local foods at a cooking demo by Stone's Throw Café, etc.

THLD is passionately committed to "returning to wonder" as a theme for their 2021 season. The season opens on June 19, Juneteenth, commemorating the ending of slavery in the US with a day of conversation and music featuring "The Reminders". "WonderLand" will follow at the end of June. A production of Collide Theatrical Dance Company of St. Paul, this outdoor experience was created to suit safety requirements of COVID-19. A compelling story of friendship and acceptance set in a psychiatric hospital, audiences are engaged questions of "what is normal." In July, TLHD will present "The Wonder Bread Years Starring Pat Hazell" (former Seinfeld writer). A fast-paced, hilarious production that gracefully walks the line between standup and theater.

Central Square Pope County

\$6,560

Central Square will expand their Curbside Craft Kit program to provide opportunities for families to create art in the safety of their homes. The grant will fund the purchase of a display stand and additional supplies to create a variety of kits in the coming months. In addition, they will launch a new website to safely communicate with their audience and sell the art of the local artisans. The grant will pay for technical support expertise to expand the new website and a marketing budget to help achieve their continued goal of providing arts education and access to the arts for the community.

Historic Holmes Theatre

**Becker County** 

\$7,000

Historic Holmes Theatre project is to complete a comprehensive Cultural Plan for the City of Detroit Lakes. The plan will include elements such as community dialogue, a list of stakeholders, an inventory of local creatives, building a web presence, and suggestions for next steps. Once the plan is written and adopted by the City, HHT will present the cultural plan to the public at an event at the Holmes that will bring together businesses and artists to nonprofits, schools, city/county officials, industry, faith community, and the Native American community. HHT believes all stakeholders can benefit from a strong, focused plan to bring the arts to the forefront of community life.

Perham Center for the Arts

**Otter Tail County** 

\$6,750

Perham Center for the Arts will pay the expenses to power wash, scrape, sand, prime and paint eaves troughs on the building. Due to the extreme height of the building, the contractor will rent a boom lift in order to access the work area. It is essential to make these improvements to preserve the structure as a community gathering place for arts enrichment and experiences. Its architectural and cultural history has enriched the lives of community members since 1922. Recently, the structure has been repurposed as a Center for the Arts and will provide arts opportunities and activities for ongoing generations.

Prairie Renaissance Cultural Alliance

**Stevens County** 

\$2.175

PRCA will upgrade their gallery with the purchase and installation of track lighting in the gallery exhibit area and front windows to better showcase the art and items on display. Two options were provided by Wehking Electric for flood style heads in each area. Option 1 uses LED light bulbs, and option 2 is an LED fixture built into the lamp head. This will better define the exhibit space and augment the art shown there while helping to further eliminate the "tunnel" effect noted by the consultant that can draw the customer's eye away from the art. Likewise, directed lighting in the front windows will attract walk-ins and better convey the promise of the treasures inside.

These digital offerings will serve artists, learners, scholars, and visitors from the region and beyond.

TLHD's Legacy grant will pay for the rental of a covered, outdoor stage to be placed on the TLHD property for September of 2021 to help create an environment for quality outdoor programming. Additionally, the grant will help cover costs of making repairs to the indoor stage, including resurfacing and painting, and supplies to accomplish the tasks, for optimal experience indoors.

Songs in the revue will be written by artists from the aforementioned underrepresented populations.

Detroit Lakes Public School Community Ed Becker County

DL Community Education will produce and present a month-long summer musical theatre day camp that will engage students, ages 5th -10th grade, concluding with three public performances of the junior version of Matilda at the Historic Holmes Theatre in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota. Students will be involved in all aspects of musical theatre and gain friendships and confidence in performing. Dates for performances are the evenings of Thursday, June 24 and Friday, June 25 with a matinee on Saturday, June 26. If the production needs go virtual, the directors will create zoom practice schedules and the shows will take part in the city's open air band shell.

Fergus Falls Community Ed Early Childhood Otter Tail County

\$2,980

Fergus Falls Community Ed Early Childhood will sponsor "the NEST", a community-based, child-led interactive installation activated by visitors' performative participation. They will build a temporary home and evolving art space made-up of artifacts, artwork, and curated building materials to reveal and create the stories of a migrating creature in the Lincoln school building. Participants invent and explore the creature's story through open-ended play, creative movement, art-making, and collective storytelling and populate its giant home, an empty armature structure, with collected materials. This interactive event will May 6, 2021 and all families in the community are invited to participate in its creation.

Henning Landmark Center

Otter Tail County

\$2,090

Landmark Center will sponsor Glass Blowing artist Jon Offutt 's mobile glass blowing unit to present glassblowing demonstration for 2 days, May 22 and 22, 2021 with six 30-40 minute demonstrations per day. These demonstrations will be presented free of charge to any community members of students that wish to participate. These fast moving demonstrations provide historical context of glass blowing, while explaining the science behind the process and the many techniques required to master the art. Participants will see several pieces of blown glass art come to life start to finish within a short 30-40 minute free demonstration.

Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County Clay County

\$3,000

HCSCC will present the fiber art exhibit "Forced to Flee" from July 3 to Nov 7, 2021. Thirty-six richly colored art quilts vividly depict the perils of refugee reality in the touring exhibition Forced to Flee assembled by Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA). Close examination of seemingly abstract images reveal the painful memorials of Holocaust survivors or the orange life jackets of the Lesvos refugees. Some works depict the strikingly realistic long lines of the "Displaced" or the "Child Behind Barbed Wire." As SAQA states, "Throughout history people have been forced to flee from their homes for their own safety and survival due to war, oppression, natural disasters, and atrocious human rights violations. The refugee crisis has imposed severe impacts on the social, economic, and political structures of host countries, especially poor and developing countries. This powerful and timely exhibition illustrates the global challenges arising from the current refugee crisis impacting countries across the globe".

Kicks Band of Fargo Moorhead

Clay County

\$2,000

FM Kicks Band will present a summer park concert on June 24, 2021 at Gooseberry Mounds Park, Moorhead, MN, that will include collaborations with regional musicians. A short Q&A with the audience will follow the concert. The outstanding musicians of The Kicks Band will provide a high-quality jazz arts performance, supplemented with anecdotes and historical references to introduce each upcoming selection. The music will feature jazz arrangements of well-loved big band classics (e.g. Duke Ellington's C Jam Blues) and introduce audiences to contemporary works (e.g. Gordon Goodwin's Jazz Police). An informed audience is more likely to enjoy a concert (and come to another), so we'll also incorporate gentle (not pedantic) educational moments. This "break" between songs allows the musicians a couple of minutes to get the next chart ready.

Perham Center for the Arts

Perham Center for the Arts will present "The Wichita Lineman--A Tribute To Glen Campbell. The performance will be held on October 2022 at the Perham High School Auditorium. With the many challenges of the past year of the pandemic, people are hungry to get back to some sort of normalcy and no better way to do that then listening and relaxing to music of the one of the greatest legends of his time. The Glen Campbell Show will definitely appeal to a more "mature" audience, but we feel the number of "younger folk" appearing with their parents is increasing. Shows of this caliber are primarily held in larger cities and by bringing a show to a rural community, gives seniors an opportunity to experience the arts that they probably would not be able to experience otherwise.

The Rourke Art Gallery Museum

Clay County

The Rourke will present a photography exhibition of noted Minnesota photographer Wayne Gudmundson from Sept. 10 to Oct. 11, 2021. The exhibit will be comprised of two bodies of Gudmundson's work: 1) "White Earth Window" - a series of silver gelatin prints documenting sites from the White Earth Reservation in Minnesota, selected in consultation with Ojibwe elders and scholars, that examines the Ojibwe experience from pre-reservation folkways and stories through the White Earth Settlement Act in the mid-1980s; and 2) "What Place is This" - a series of silver gelatin prints documenting the contemporary locations of infamous and historic battles, atrocities, and murders amongst and within the groups (Spanish, American, native peoples, and Mexican) who have inhabited the area surrounding Tucson, Arizona. In addition to the regular public opening reception for the exhibit, a special presentation is planned on the closing day of the exhibit, which will coincide with Indigenous Peoples Day, Monday, October 11, 2021.

Central Lakes Symphony Orchestra

CLSO is planning to collaborate with the Twin Cities Ballet (TCB) on a performance that focuses on Mental Health. For centuries composers have been writing music as a way to express society's issues with mental illness artistically, to comfort communities dealing with struggles, and/or to deal with their own mental health. Composer Pytor Tchaikovsky did this very thing with his piece, Symphony No. 6 "Pathetique." He expressed his own struggles with depression and suicidal thoughts through this music. Traditionally, this piece is not performed with ballet dancers, but we want to illustrate Tchaikovsky's sound with the visual art of ballet, highly-trained ballet dancers will complement the orchestra as they seek to interpret the music as a force of healing in times of dire stress. Although organizations are facing unprecedented challenges in these times when live audiences cannot gather, CLSO and TCB are aiming to perform together in February 2021 at the 1000-seat Performing Arts Center in Alexandria, where physical distancing is possible if it is still required at that time.

Kicks Band of Fargo Moorhead

Clay County

\$3,000

FM Kicks Band will partner with the Historic Holmes Theatre (Detroit Lakes) for a holiday concert tentatively scheduled on December 2021, that will include collaborations with regional musicians. A short Q&A with the audience will follow the concert. Presenting jazz by means of a holiday concert is designed to introduce jazz to audiences. Some will come to find musical holiday spirit, even though they're ambivalent about jazz. But soon they'll be tapping toes to a jazzy Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas. Combining the outstanding musicians of The Kicks with stellar guest artists will provide a high-quality arts experience. The concert will feature jazz arrangements of well-loved holiday music (e.g. Duke Ellington's Nutcracker Suite) and introduce audiences to contemporary works.

The Rourke Art Gallery Museum

Clay County

\$1,980

The Rourke Art Gallery + Museum has assembled a body of work from our Permanent Collections in an exhibit titled "Frozen Music: The Midwestern Architectural Prints of James Tiernan O'Rourke" which they will tour through three branches of the Lake Agassiz Regional Library (LARL): the Breckenridge Public Library, the Detroit Lakes Public Library, and the Moorhead Public Library. Because of his legacy as an impassioned arts leader and art collector, it has been forgotten or overlooked in some circles that O'Rourke was also an accomplished printmaker whose work was widely exhibited and collected. O'Rourke and his contemporary, Charles Beck were mentored by professor Cyrus M. Running of Concordia College, Moorhead. MN. Across his drawings, paintings, and prints, O'Rourke's major subject was architecture. The sites O'Rourke portrayed in his art ranged widely in location owing to his extensive travels but he would always return to the grand old buildings of his birth state, North Dakota, and his chosen home state, Minnesota.

Act Up Theatre Clay County \$2,500

The grant will fund a portion of the general operating expenses including seasonal marketing, postage, insurance and box office supplies for the upcoming 2021 season and the purchase of 3 portable microphones to expand their audio equipment. Act Up Theatre provides musical performing opportunities to young adults with a focus on musical productions that create a more socially conscious community.
